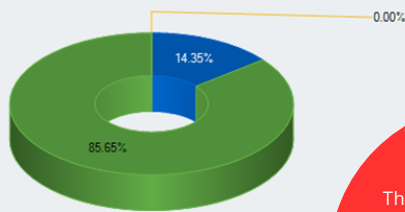


Do School Wellness Assessments work?

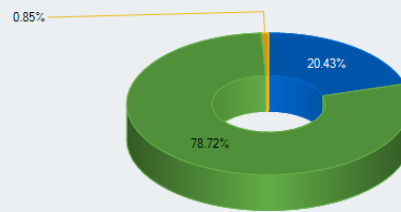
Middle School Students took the 55 question assessment in April 2022 and again in December 2022 and were asked:
Do you know someone who deserves to have their life taken because of something they have done to you or someone you know?

Real Data provided from a School Wellness Assessment done at one middle school in the U.S.



April 2022

This assessment report identifies all high risk students and visually shows the school administrator what school is struggling with specific issues.



December 2022

This confidential assessment report compares all previous screenings done at the district to allow the school administrator to see progress or lack of progress in high risk categories.

In 12/22, the Middle School indicates 20.43% of the students taking the assessment report they know someone who deserves to have their life taken. This is the highest percentage recorded since the assessment was first completed in 2019.

In 4/22, the Middle School indicates 14.35% of the students taking the assessment report they know someone who deserves to have their life taken.

In 11/21, the Middle School indicated 10% of the students taking the assessment state they know someone who deserves to have their life taken.

In 4/21, the Middle School indicates 15.24% of the students taking the assessment state they know someone who deserves to have their life taken.

In 12/20, the Middle School indicates 11.71% of the students taking the assessment state they know someone who deserves to have their life taken.
